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#### **Year 5 Playground Leadership Training**



Since the start of the Autumn Term, Ridgeway Academy's Primary School Sports Partnership has been training Year 5 students within our local primary schools to become Playground Leaders. Students had the opportunity to learn the skills and characteristics of a good leader, how to plan a sporting session and how to adapt a session using the 'STEP' principle. Throughout the sessions, it was brilliant to have high quality discussions based around leadership and working with people, which set an excellent basis for the rest of the session with students being able to use self-reflection to evaluate their performance and suggest how they can improve.

As part of the training, students then planned and lead their own games to the rest of their class, using what they had learnt. It was brilliant to see the students grow in confidence, as well as knowledge, to become competent leaders and produce some excellent games.

As previously mentioned, schools will then use the leaders during break and lunchtimes to support younger students within the school.


