Core offer

Ridgeway Academy is an inclusive school and offers the following range of provision to support all children where there is a need.

Provision

Social Skills programmes/support including strategies to enhance self-esteem

- Protective Behaviours delivered by trained Behaviour Consultant, HLTA's and DOLS.
- Specific support from CAT (Communication and Autism Team) for named pupils with ASD (Autistic Spectrum Disorder)
- Intervention Programs
- Autism support group (Communication club)
- Circle of support for students with friendship difficulties

Access to a supportive environment- IT facilities/equipment/resources (inc. preparation)

- ICT suites/library
- Laptops for staff
- Laptops and/or Reading pens for students who require one for their normal way of working
- Interactive whiteboards in classes
- Programmes to support learning: Accelerated Reader, PIXL maths support (all Year 7 & 8 students), Year 7 Catch-Up Premium classes

Strategies/programmes to support speech and language

- Individual children with SALT (Speech and Language Team) support have a specific programme delivered 1:1 by trained TA or special advisory teacher from the Communication and Autism Team (CAT)
- ELKLAN trained Teaching Assistant who works 1:1 with students with Speech, Language and Communication needs (SLCN).
- Communication club
- 'Read Write Inc.' Phonics intervention

Mentoring activities

- Selected Y12 trained as Anti-Bullying mentors
- TAs trained to deliver learning mentoring for selected students
- HLTA mentoring for KS4 students for organisation and motivational purposes
- Vulnerable children will have a 'Network' of named people to talk to initiated and monitored by the SENDCO.
- Safe space in H Block for students with emotional difficulties
- Identified 'Key Adults' to support vulnerable students where appropriate

Access to strategies/programmes to support Occupational Therapy (OT)/Physiotherapy needs

OT/Physio referrals are via GP or School Nurse. Our SENDCO can support this process
