Google Guardian notifications

You will now have received the notification invitation to join as a parent to Google Guardians. This allows you to monitor the work set for your child and monitor their submission. It will also allow you to see any outstanding which will need to be completed by your child.

When you accept the invitation please ensure that you are logged into your personal email account i.e. yahoo, work email, Hotmail, outlook, Gmail, Virgin Mail, SKY Mail, BT Mail etc. This should be done on a desktop PC or laptop and not from your mobile phone or tablet device. Please make sure before accepting Google Guardians, that you are signed out of your child's Google classroom account. This will avoid accepting the invitation and registering under your child's name.

The latest version of the MyChildAtSchool (MCAS) user guide has now been added to the website, here you can get further information on how to update your contact details (Page 6 Account Options). It is vital that you ensure your contact details are up to date in order to receive Google Guardian summaries. We would like to encourage all students to use the Click & Collect service to borrow books from the Library. On the school website click Portals then Accessit Library. At the top right of the page, click Guest then click on the blue SSO button and enter your full school email address. Click Next then enter your password when prompted.
