Headteacher's Message

It has been wonderful for the staff and I to welcome all students back to school this week, to see them working hard in their lessons and to witness them re-connect with their friends during their social time. Students have embraced the control measures in place to keep us all safe magnificently! I finished my Headteacher address to students in a live broadcast on Wednesday with a quote from Vladimir Lenin - "There are decades where nothing happens and there are weeks where decades happen." The last couple of weeks have felt rather like this and I know there will be some anxieties around the full return to school and the calculation of grades for Year 11 and Year 13: please do rest assured that all will be dealt with sensitively and sensibly.

As I write, students are completing their third lateral flow tests and I have been informed that the home testing kits for students have been delivered into school; we will start the distribution of these next week. Staff have started with twice weekly testing using these devices, we will provide step by step guidance, but from a personal position, they are simple to use. I would like to publicly thank the team of staff who have enabled our asymptomatic testing to run so efficiently throughout this term - over 3000 tests have been conducted.

We look ahead to our virtual Celebration Awards assemblies for each year group on the final day of the spring term to recognise excellent effort and achievement in each year group, across subjects and enrichment activities.

Attendance

Attendance to school each day is mandatory. The government are insisting that schools follow robust attendance procedures including sanctioning non-attendance through Fixed Penalty Notices issued by Hertfordshire County Council. It is vital that students are here every day to ensure they are able to achieve their full potential. Any student with attendance

below 95% will have to provide medical evidence for any further absence otherwise the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

Please be mindful of our neighbours when collecting your child from school at the end of the day. The layby opposite the school should not be used as a pickup zone as it makes it difficult for the residents to access their driveways. Where possible please arrange to meet your child a short walk from the school. Many thanks for your understanding.

School uniform is mandatory each day, students arriving at school without the correct uniform will be sent home to change. 

Over the next two weeks we will be giving Year 7-10 groups assessments. This will enable us to judge where students are in their learning and understanding, and also tailor future teaching to close the gaps. It is imperative that students revise for these assessments and attend fully equipped. Further information about topics to be assessed has been shared within students' Google Classrooms. Students should have the following; blue or black pen, green pen, HB pencil, 30cm ruler, geometry set and scientific calculator.

Any necessary resetting will take place after the Easter holiday.

Year 11 will be assessed every week based on topics they have been taught. Teachers will use this information to provide evidence of a GCSE grade. Again it is essential students revise and take these assessments seriously. Further guidance can be found in Google Classroom. Students must come prepared as if they were to sit a mathematics examination.



Q & A Session with Julie Hesmondhalgh Written by Tilly Morris, Year 12

On the 22nd of March, Year 12 Performing Arts students were given the amazing opportunity to have a virtual one to one Q & A session with the well-known actress Julie Hesmondhalgh. You will probably know her from playing the beloved character Hayley Cropper on Coronation Street, who was a revolutionary due to the fact she was the first transsexual character in a British soap opera. Our class, however, were given this opportunity to ask more about one of her more recent roles, Mother Courage. Year 12 are currently studying the play Mother Courage and her Children and it was originally written in 1939 by German poet and dramatist Bertolt Brecht, but in Julie's version, it has been rewritten by Anna Jordan and has been made into a modernised and unique retelling of a classic. She was able to give us fantastic insight into the play, the ins and outs of such a complex character and gave us such detailed and analysed answers to our many questions. It is helping us massively in analysing the play in lessons and help us understand it in a more complex way. Not only were we able to ask questions about the play, but she gave us such personal and inspiring advice on the industry and told us many stories about her acting journey and how she got to where she is today. Besides her incredible advice and stories, she made us all feel truly hopeful and confident in carrying on our own acting journeys and once again instilled our hopes of the world of theatre and acting making a bigger and better comeback after such a terrible time this past year. It was an incredible opportunity and we are so grateful to have been given the chance to talk to such a fantastic woman!
