

## **Attendance News**

## Is my child too ill for school?

There are clear government guidelines for schools that say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. The below guidance taken from the NHS website and includes information on common childhood illnesses where school is missed when it needn't be. It is vital to follow this, as school will not authorise your child's absence if they feel they are well enough to be in school (this could lead to consequences for parents/carers, which we would like to avoid!):

- <u>Coughs and Colds</u> It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or cold. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.
- Sore Throat You can still send your child to school if they have a sore throat. But if they also have a fever, they should stay at home until the fever goes away.
- Menstrual Cramps School should not be missed due to 'the time of the month'. It's important for your child to have pads or tampons with them at all times and ensure that they are comfortable making regular trips to the bathroom. Consider a suitable 'hiding place' for products, whether it be a spare 'pencil case' or a side pocket of their bag as some children can feel nervous about sanitary products being discovered. It's also a good idea to have a spare pair of underwear in case of emergency. Consider whether medication is needed if nausea and pain is recurring and talk to school about whether this can be stored for use at school, or whether your child will need to take this before school. We have emergency products available should a child not have access to them. Please make your child aware that teachers and staff at school will be more than prepared to help with this problem.
- <u>Conjunctivitis</u> You don't need to keep your child away from school if they have conjunctivitis. Do get advice from your pharmacist. Encourage your child not to rub their eyes and to wash their hands regularly.
- Head Lice and Nits There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice. You should treat your child and send them into school.
- Vomiting or Diarrhoea Your child should stay at home until 24 hours after the last time they were sick.



## THC Vape Awareness

There is an increased trend in young people nationally, for using vapes and illegal substances in the form of vapes. A recent study in 2022 found the use of Vapes in young people had tripled from 15% in 2021 to 44% in 2022 <a href="https://cdn.themix.org.uk/uploads/2022/10/Drug-and-alcohol-usage-amongst-youngpeople-2022.pdf">https://cdn.themix.org.uk/uploads/2022/10/Drug-and-alcohol-usage-amongst-youngpeople-2022.pdf</a>.

There is an increase in the use of a specific type of vape containing THC oil. THC is the main oil present in cannabis plants and is an illegal psychoactive substance. Most concerningly, these vapes are being produced in a range of bright colours and styles to appeal to young people. Side effects of using THC vapes can include drowsiness, vomiting, hallucinations, tiredness and memory loss. Any Cannabis based product is especially damaging to a teenage brain.

We are increasing our drug awareness education through PDE lessons, assemblies and ELD days and have already increased our searches of individuals where we may have a suspicion that vapes are being used. Any student found in possession of an illegal substance is at risk of significant school sanctions. We strongly advise families to discuss this trend with their children and make them aware of the dangers associated with any kind of drug use. If you have a suspicion that your child has been offered vapes outside of school, we encourage you to inform us and the police.
